

On August 15 from 0635 to 0800 and from 1600 to 1802, the McNary fish transport system was in primary bypass and from 0800 to 1600 the collection channel was dewatered to repair an overflow screen in the area of the transition screen. At 1802, normal collection resumed. No mortality associated with the screen repair.

From August 15 to August 24, McNary Dam has trucked 147,925 fish mostly sub-yearling Chinook. These ranged for a high of 44,888 on the August 16 to a low on 4,300 on August 22. Fish were trucked every day until Aug 23 when we began trucking every other day. The project went to every other day trucking because numbers were low, temps had dropped below 70, and mortality was pretty low. They went back to every day trucking on the 26 and 27 because number increased. We had above 30,00 until Aug 19 when counts dropped to 13,00 and then down to 4000 on Aug 22. River temperatures taken from sample room ranged for 73.5 on August 16 to 68.7 on August 24.
