



CUMULATIVE PRECIPITATION WATER YEAR 2006


COLUMBIA BASIN ABOVE GRAND COULEE




SNAKE RIVER BASIN ABOVE ICE HARBOR

ABOVE NORMAL PRECIPITATION and ABOVE NORMAL TEMPERATURES IN JUNE.

Precipitation Summary

A STRONG UPPER LEVEL RIDGE REMAINED OVER THE WESTERN STATES CAUSING ABOVE AVERAGE TEMPERATURES. THE RIDGE FLATTENED OCCASIONALLY ALLOWING PERIODIC PACIFIC COLD FRONTS TO MOVE AMPLE AMOUNTS OF MOISTURE INTO THE REGION IN JUNE.

June precipitation was: 113 percent of normal (1971-2000) at Columbia above Coulee, 93 percent of normal at the Snake River above Ice Harbor, and 118 percent of normal at Columbia above the Dalles.

Seasonal (October through June) precipitation was: 110 percent of normal (1971-2000) at Columbia above Coulee, 123 percent of normal at the Snake River above Ice Harbor, and 112 percent of normal at Columbia above the Dalles.

There were precipitation records tied or broken in June. Some of the records included: Spokane,WA 0.89 inches and Lewiston,ID 0.67 inches on June 5th; Pocatello, ID 0.73 inches on June 10th; Meacham, ID 0.79 inches on June 14th.

Temperature Summary

The 31 station temperature index for the Pacific Northwest departed +0.8 degrees from normal relative to the 1971-2000 normals. Mean temperature departures ranged from -28.1 to 6.2 degrees.

Record high temperature records tied or broken in June included: from June 25th through June 27th various high records were broken in Washington and western Oregon. Record high temperatures ranged from 82 degrees to over 100 degrees. Some of the locations and record temperatures in degrees (F) were..Medford,OR 105; Roseburg,OR 95; Salem,OR 100; Portland,OR 102; and Seattle,WA 90.

Record low temperature records in degrees (F)that were broken in June included 31 at Meacham,ID and 47 at Seattle, WA.
