

Dear Chief Operations Manager:

The Umatilla Tribe has implemented a project to restore Pacific lamprey (*Entosphenus tridentata*) to the tribes' ceded waters. This on-going project is funded by the Bonneville Power Administration and managed by the CTUIR. As part of the project we are requesting permission from the USACOE for access to enter The Dalles Dam project and collect adult Pacific lamprey.

We will explore deploying traps off the face of the dam and/or placing traps inside the fishway behind picketed leads at areas that are highly coordinated with USACOE staff and workgroups from June through October. These traps have proven to be very effective at capturing lamprey at both The Dalles and John Day dam. CTUIR will again explore trapping in The Dalles north fishway this year due to increase in brood allocation.

A key component to restoring lampreys to the Umatilla River is to collect adults for translocation to the Umatilla Basin. CTUIR would like to enter the Corp projects to collect up to 1240 adult Pacific lampreys among Bonneville (n=215), The Dalles (n=604) and John Day (n=424) dams (in separate letters of access sent to appropriate USACE staff of John Day and Bonneville) and transport to our holding facility or a holding facility located at John Day SMF. The CTUIR will have all necessary permits for this activity. We will coordinate with Mrs. Tammy Mackey at Portland District office and project biologists at Bonneville Dam, Mr. Bob Cordie and Ms. Erin Kovalchuk at The Dalles Dam, and Mr. Miro Zyndol at John Day Dam. We will continue to coordinate and report our collections with all USACE staff to ensure a smooth and safe operation, just like in the past recent years. CTUIR has the current versions of "[A Guide For Fish Researchers](#)" for each appropriate project, and CTUIR will supply all information requested in the Guide prior to work beginning.

We appreciate the cooperation the USACOE has provided to date regarding Pacific lamprey, a culturally important resource of Northwest tribes.
