COORDINATION TITLE - 16DET03 Ladder Outage

COORDINATION DATE - 07 April 2016

PROJECT - Minto Fish Facility

RESPONSE DATE - 30 April 2016

Description of the problem - Flap gate valve installation will occur in the pre-sort pool at the Minto Fish Facility that will prevent draining if a failure were to occur. This will require the ladder to be offline for a couple of days.

Type of operation required - The fish ladder was scheduled to be out of service April 25-26 at the Minto Fish Facility. Due to delay with the contractor the outage will need to be rescheduled and is targeting early May, but may be as late as May 16. The pre-sort and the ladder will be run the morning of the outage.

Impact on facility operation - The ladder at the Minto Fish Facility will not be available for operation during flap gate valve installation.

Dates of impacts/repairs - **TBD**, early May, as late as May 16

Expected impacts on fish - The outage of the fish ladder will minimally affect collection and passage of returning adult winter steelhead by delaying upstream migration for a couple of days.

Hi Chris,

NMFS has reviewed MOC # 16DET03 Ladder Outage, and we are ok with the proposed 1-2 day shutdown of the Minto ladder to install a flap-gate valve. We would prefer this work to be done during the normal shutdown period, but understand that this is add-on work that could not be started earlier in the year. ODFW has indicated that they will clear the trap the morning of April 25th, and then will be work the trap up again on April 26, so the trap will essentially be out of service for one day.
